Emergency Response Plan

All personnel will be trained in emergency procedures, roles and responsibilities during the orientation process. If an emergency occurs, the following procedure will be followed by all personnel:

- 1. Sound alarm or blow whistle to notify all other workers
- 2. Clear the danger area immediately
- 3. Meet at the designated muster point (pickup truck) area if emergency occurs
- 4. Call 911
- 5. Do a head count
- 6. Secure a controlled perimeter around danger area, if possible
